DISTANCE LEARNING PLAN OVERVIEW



- Q During Michigan Safe Start Economic Engagement Phases 5 and 6, and possibly Phase 4, when the district resumes face to face instruction, we are recommending an A/B schedule.
- This schedule would allow approximately half of our students to attend school every other week or two consecutive days per week face to face. Students not attending in-person will continue attending through distance learning.
- As we update the district's plan we will continue to collaborate with stakeholders before making a final decision. All safety guidelines pertaining to the MI Safe Schools: Michigan 2020-21 Return to School Roadmap will be followed.

- Classes 1-7 total 85 minutes per week...individual class lengths vary

- Student class schedules will be made live on StudentVue later this week and will be mailed home to all families

CITY 7-12 WEEKLY SCHEDULE



6TH GRADE CENTER FOR ECONOMICOLOGY DISTANCE LEARNING SCHEDULE

- Equal time split between both homeroom teachers with live instruction to occur from 9-12, Tuesday-Thursday through synchronous learning
- Art, Music, and PE will be guided to occur as asynchronous activities during afternoons as well as Monday and Friday
- Teachers are finalizing a schedule that will allow for a balance of time between all subjects in the most student-friendly way
- Teachers will share office hours for afternoons on Tuesday-Thurs as well Monday and Friday
- Asynchronous activities/projects/homework to occur during afternoons and Mondays/Fridays
- Detailed schedule and homerooms to be released soon!







CAS hours will still be required but your service hours may look different given restrictions



Personal Project will be supported through 8th hour and during asynchronous times and activities



Extended Essay will be supported with various processes:

8th hour

Teacher Mentor meetings
Asynchronous activities



Learner Profile and Approaches to Learning exploration will be embedded into instruction throughout and will be adjusted to apply to current student needs



IB requirements will be taught and explored throughout all classes and in 8th hour
